ALL students need the following:

- A planner for writing down homework assignments and due dates
- A Chromebook, laptop or tablet (external keyboard recommended) for writing papers, creating presentations, etc. that they can bring to school daily, plus a charger as needed
- A pencil pouch or box of some kind to help keep everything together and organized from class to class
- A lock for their locker. We recommend locks with resettable 4-digit combinations such as this:

NOTE: Lockers are very narrow! Please keep binders to 1" or smaller.

ENGLISH (9th - 12th)

One 1" 3-ring binder with 5 dividers
Lined paper
2 highlighter pens
Pens & pencils
1 packet of post-it notes (for bookmarking)
2 journal-style notebooks

ESL (9th - 12th)

List of needed supplies will be shared on the 1st day of class.

SPANISH (9th - 12th)

One 1" 3-ring binder with at least 5 dividers
Blank, ruled, 3-hole punched writing paper
Pens or pencils (what they prefer)

MATH (all classes)

One 1" 3-ring binder with at least 3 dividers and pockets
Graph paper and lined paper
Pencils and eraser

Colored pen for correcting homework
Colored pencils and/or highlighter (optional, but nice to have)

Geometry (9th) also needs:

Scientific calculator (TI30Xa is a good model), or graphing calculator (Texas Instruments brand preferred)
Protractor and Compass
Case to hold protractor, compass and other supplies (optional, but recommended)

Algebra 2 (10th), Pre-Calculus (11th) and Calculus (12th) also need:

Texas Instruments (preferred brand) graphing calculator

SCIENCE

Environmental Studies (9th), Biology (10th) and Chemistry (11th):

Pens and pencils
Colored pen for corrections
Colored pencils
One 1" 3-ring binder
Texas Instrument 30Xa (TI30Xa) calculator (or the same one that is used in math)
Graph paper and lined paper
Spiral Notebook (approx. 100 pages) - *optional, but strongly encouraged for notes*

Physics (12th):

One 1" 3-ring binder with at least 3 dividers and pockets
Pencils and Eraser
Graph paper and lined paper
Colored pen for correcting homework
Colored pencils
Graphing utility: a Texas Instruments TI-84 (or better) graphing calculator

SOCIAL STUDIES (9th - 12th)

One 1/2" 3-ring binder
Lined paper
2 highlighter pens
Pens & pencils
Optional: dividers to separate old portfolios from current work

ADVISORY 9th - 10th

9th graders need a 1/2" portfolio binder
(10th graders need to get one if they don't already have one)

ADVISORY 11th

No special supplies needed.

ADVISORY 12th

1" binder with the college counseling handbook printed out
Dividers to help organize college, India and internship materials
